Registration Information

How to Register You may pick up an application from one of the following locations: Supervisor of Elections office Senior Services Center Driver's License Office HRS WIC Public Library Hunting/Fishing License Locations or you may call the elections office and a form will be mailed to you. You may also visit our website at www.VoteOkeechobee.com where you will find an easy to complete online registration form. Once you have completed your voter registration application, mail or deliver it to the elections office. A voter information card will be mailed to you.

Requirements to Register You may register to vote if you are:

- a U.S. Citizen
- a resident of the State of Florida (your county of residence)
- 18 years of age (you may pre-register at 16)
- in possession of civil rights pertaining to voting

You must register at least 29 days prior to voting in any Election.

Closed Primary Florida is a closed primary state, in a primary election voters may only vote for candidates in their party of registration. By not selecting a party when you register, your vote is limited in the primary election to nonpartisan races and issues. In the general election, you may vote for any candidate, regardless of party affiliation.

Party Affiliation You may choose to register in a political party (major or minor) or register with no party affiliation. You may change your party affiliation, however the completed application must be submitted at least 29 days prior to a primary election. **EXCEPTION:** UNIVERSAL PRIMARY CONTEST

EXCEPTION: <u>UNIVERSAL PRIMARY CONTEST</u> If all candidates have the same party affiliation and the winner will have no opposition in the general election, then <u>ALL</u> qualified voters may vote on that "Universal Primary Contest" in the primary election.

Voter Responsibility It is very important that each voter keep his or her information current with the elections office.

Voting Information

Election Day Voting Voting in a precinct in which you do not live is illegal. You must vote only at the precinct in which you reside. You are encouraged to report any changes in your registration (i.e., address, name, party affiliation) to the Elections Office. A current and valid picture / signature ID is required.

Absentee (Vote by Mail) Any registered voter may apply by mail, phone, e-mail, or in person to the Elections Office for an absentee ballot. Absentee ballots will not be forwarded, so please keep your address updated. An absentee ballot must be received by your Elections Office no later than 7 p.m. Election Day.

Early Voting The law permits voters to vote in person prior to election day. Early Voting begins up to 15 days before election day and ends the Saturday before election day. A current and valid picture / signature ID is required.

To Remain a Voter Registration is permanent as long as you remain a qualified voter and a resident of Florida, please <u>keep</u> your <u>address current</u> with the Supervisor of Elections. You may <u>change your</u> <u>address</u>, by phone, in person or in writing. Also, if you <u>change your name</u> by marriage or other legal process, the Supervisor of Elections must be notified in writing.

Identification Requirements In order to vote you must present a current and valid picture / signature identification. It can be one form, such as a Florida driver license or Florida issued ID, or two separate forms of identification. If you do not have proper ID you will be allowed to vote a provisional ballot.
